## Ohio Collaborative to Prevent Infant Mortality (OCPIM) to host 4<sup>TH</sup> Quarter Meeting in Cleveland

Government leaders, state agencies, non-profits, and community-driven organizations gather to share data points and best practices for reducing infant mortality in Ohio

What: The Ohio Collaborative to Prevent Infant Mortality (OCPIM) will be hosting its Quarterly Meeting for the second face-to-face forum on the barriers that affect the health of our communities and to share best practices in improving infant health outcomes and reducing infant mortality across the state of Ohio. Joining the open discussion will be Councilman Kevin J. Kelly, Ward 13, President, Cleveland City Council, and Cuyahoga County Executive Armond Budish. Michelle Edison, MPH, MS, OCPIM's Northeast Region Co-lead, Pathways HUB Coordinator, Mahoning County District Board of Public Health will present a regional look at infant mortality in the Northeastern counties, and will be joined by representatives from the Ohio Department of Health's Rena Oza-Frank, PhD, RD, Data and Surveillance Administrator for the Bureau of Maternal, Child and Family Health, a representative from the Ohio Department of Medicaid and other key speakers. Kenn Harris, Senior Project Director, National Institute for Child Health Quality (NICHQ) will share national best practices related to an upcoming Healthy Start initiative. The meeting will culminate with a short film on racism, toxic stress, and birth outcomes -- Toxic: A Black Woman's Story.
